- **Refuse:** The airport actively discourages the use of single-use plastics and other non-essential items, promoting a culture of conscious consumption among passengers and staff.
- **Reduce:** Efforts are made to minimize waste generation at the source through various initiatives, including efficient resource management and optimized operational processes.
- **Reuse:** Jaipur Airport encourages the reuse of materials wherever possible, extending the lifecycle of products and reducing the need for new resources.
- **Repurpose:** Creative solutions are employed to repurpose waste materials, transforming them into valuable resources for other applications.
- **Recycle:** The airport has established comprehensive recycling systems to ensure that waste materials are properly segregated and processed for recycling, diverting them from landfills.
